We honor and greet you in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Thanks be to God our Father for bringing us together another year.



Historicity

United Churches Fellowship was founded by the late Bishop James H. Mobley and the late Bishop William Hathaway. During a hospital stay, Bishop Mobley received the following revelation from God: Small churches are falling through the cracks and are not being recognized by larger churches. Souls are dying...and God has said, "Gather my people."

The leader of a small church himself, Bishop Mobley was acutely aware of the lack of support, limited resources, and separation experienced because of the independence of small congregations.

Bishop Mobley shared his vision with Bishop and Lady Hathaway, Pastor of the Refuge for the Perishing Holy Temple of Bristol, PA on Saturday, November 11, 1995. He gained Bishop Hathaway's immediate and full support. That day, the United Churches Fellowship was birthed. Bishop Mobley also shared his vision with pastors of other small congregations including Bishop David Graham,
Shepherdess Linnie Jones, Pastor Wendell Robbins, and Pastor Joe Williams, all of whom united themselves with this ministry. Joel 2:16 is the foundation for the vision of United Churches Fellowship.

The major goals include:

- * Becoming a ministry of helps
- * Uniting to help other small churches
- * Serving and co-laboring with one another
- * Promoting Christ

Bishop James Mobley went on to be with the Lord on August 29, 1997. One year following his demise, Elder Harry W. Pendleton, Pastor of Faith and Love Center Pentecostal Church, under the leadership of Bishop Hathaway, was consecrated as the Presiding Bishop of the United Churches Fellowship.





Bishop Harry W. Pendleton, Sr.is the Presiding Prelate, United Churches Fellowship and Founder and Pastor of Faith & Love Center Pentecostal Church, Philadelphia, PA.

Bishop Harry Pendleton was converted in June of 1978 during a prayer revival at New Jerusalem Church of God in Christ, led by the late Elder Clinton Mobley. A short time later, he joined Canaan Church of Pentecost, where the late Bishop James H. Mobley was pastor. He served in various capacities at Canaan, including deacon and Sunday School teacher, where his love for teaching God's Word grew.

In 1984, he answered the call to preach God's Word and was ordained as an Elder on October 11, 1987, under the pastorate of Bishop Mobley. He served faithfully as an Associate and then Assistant Pastor of Canaan. His love for God, concern for souls and desire to labor in the kingdom of God continued to grow. After seeking the Lord for direction, he was led to begin a ministry in the Norristown, PA area. Faith and Love Center Pentecostal Church held its first service under his leadership on June 5, 1994. Approximately one year later, he, his family, and the members of Faith and Love Center returned to Canaan to assist Bishop Mobley and the Canaan Church family.

On October 29, 1995, he was consecrated by Bishop Mobley as Pastor of Canaan Church. The two churches were merged under the name Faith and Love Center Pentecostal Church. In 1995, under God's leadership, Bishop Mobley formed the United Churches Fellowship. In August 1998, after Bishop Mobley's demise, Pastor Pendleton was consecrated to the office of Bishop of United Churches Fellowship.

September 2019, Bishop Pendleton's dream to start a biblical institute finally came to fruition with the opening of the Pendleton Institute of Biblical Studies.

Today, Bishop Pendleton continues to serve as Senior Pastor of Faith and Love Center Pentecostal Church and Presiding Prelate of the United Churches Fellowship. He and his wife, Delinda Pendleton, are the proud parents of two sons, Harry Wesley Jr. and Brian Joseph, and the grandparents of three lovely granddaughters, Taylor Grace, Arielle, and Gabrielle.

His favorite scripture verse, Romans 12:3, reflects his humble servant-leadership character.

"For I say, through the grace given unto me, to every man that is among you, not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think; but to think soberly, according as God hath dealt to every man the measure of faith."

In January 2025, under the direction of Pastor Delinda Pendleton, the Pathways to Adulthood program was revived and with it came new life and a special group of young people. Across UCF and beyond, eleven students joined us on this journey of growth and self discovery. Over the months, the young people listened to powerful presentations on various topics to help prepare them as they walk the path through the teenage years and into adulthood.

When asked if there were any other topics they wanted to learn about, one theme echoed with every response, mental health. This group of young people were insightful, transparent, and eager to learn more and do the work it takes to heal and to help others. It became clear that mental health would be the focus of our youth retreat.

In August, we set out for a weekend filled with fun, faith, and fellowship. Throughout the weekend, the youth participated in glow in the dark dodgeball, basketball, football, and other team challenges that not only provided laughter, but also connection, unity, and memories.

Our facilitators helped bring the theme to life. Janell Washington started the weekend with a thoughtful and informative session on mental health and coping strategies. She led the group in a discussion on how mental health affects us, how to identify when we are struggling, and most importantly, how to invite God into our healing process.

Nicole Johnson followed with hands-on activities that introduced real life struggles and illustrated how to put on the whole armor of God to overcome life's struggles. The youth learned that overcoming mental battles isn't about relying on our own strength but about leaning on God's truth and protection.

Pastor Kenneth Fulton closed out the retreat with a powerful message and illustration about having victory over mental health and the trials we face. As Pastor Fulton reminded us, "We are more than conquerors through Him who loved us" (Romans 8:37). His message reiterated the truth that even when our minds feel heavy, Christ has already secured our victory.

By the end of the weekend, our youth walked away knowing that victory isn't found in perfection but it is found in trusting Jesus and allowing Him to carry the load. As they walk through life's struggles, they can stand firm knowing there is victory on the other side. As our sessions came to a close, we declared this truth together with boldness, confidence, and in one voice:

God is for me.

No accusation can stop me.

Nothing can separate me from God's love.

I am more than a conqueror in Christ!

After putting up quite a fight, I slowly shifted into "Cruise" and started visiting. Partly just to get her to leave me alone because when you're depressed that's how you want to be.

I was starting to recover slightly and hesitantly from the weekly praise, worship, and sermons. But, I was still nowhere near where I should have been.

Here is where the Retreat played its part. There was such a breaking in the atmosphere on Saturday night. I was able to hear the Holy Spirit speaking very clearly to me. I was diagnosed and given my prescription right then and there. There was no hiding place nor need for one. Everyone in that room was fighting for their breakthrough, just like me,

After that night, going to church was with a renewed fulfillment and purpose. I'm shifted into "Drive" now and it feels great. My health issues haven't changed but my mindset towards them have. Since they won't leave me alone, I'll just have to drag them along with me. I know I'm better because people can see it, hear it and feel it. I am addressing anything and everything that threatens to try to take me back to that dark place. I may not be where I want to be, but I'm certainly not where I've been. Satan is upset, but so what, I gave him 5 good years. I'm not Lot's wife; I'm not looking back. Praise be to God for the wondrous work He has done in and for me!!!!


